MASE SCHOLARSHIP WINNER IN NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

In 2003, during her senior year at Palm Harbor University High School, Katie Schuler applied for, and was awarded, one of five scholarships given by MASF that year to promising art students who were pursuing college courses in visual fine arts. She is now a student at the Corcoran College of Art and Design in Washington, D.C.

Katie has gained national recognition by participating with a group of 150 artists in "Faces of the Fallen," a display of more than a thousand portraits of men and



women killed during three years of war in Iraq and Afghanistan. They are on display through November at the Women In Military Service Memorial at the gateway of Arlington National Cemetery.

The six portraits Katie painted are: National Guardsman Spc. Philip D. Brown, National Guardsman Staff Sgt. Hesley Box Jr., Army Spc. Isela Rubalcava, Army Spc. Chase R. Whitman, Marine Cpl. Dustin H. Schrage and Army Spc. James J. Holmes. With each portrait is the soldier's rank, name and branch of service. The only glimpse into who they were beyond the military is their hometown, age, and date of death.

Katie's dad, Timothy Schuler, called Small Talk editor, Marilynne Wasielewski, and notified her of Katie's accomplishment. Soon afterward a front-page feature article, with details of an interview with Katie, appeared in the North Pinellas section of the St. Petersburg Times Sunday newspaper.

Looking For A New Home

Over the past several years MASF has been fortunate to have a facility to call our home. We have used it as an office, for storage and as a workspace to receive artwork, perform jurying and judging, hanging the works on panels and returning artwork to artists. It came close to fulfilling our dream of having our own home and has markedly reduced the work required to support the Show. Unfortunately the building owner has decided to expand and now needs the space that we have been using. Since we need to move, we have decided to take the "have our own home" concept to the next step. The Board-appointed "New Home" committee has had several meetings with lively discussions on the exact needs of the Society, both for the short term and for the long term.

In the interim we have taken advantage of the offer of an adequate and secure storage space in Oldsmar. At the end of May a group of church youth volunteers assisted Herb Weed and Mike Petryszak to move all our possessions from 62nd Avenue, St Petersburg to Oldsmar.

The short term is easiest to define: Space to store and space to prepare for the annual show. The facility in Oldsmar has provided a temporary reprieve in the need for storage space but we are still searching for a workspace to prepare for the show. Board members Bob Fritz and Mary Anne Wells have kindly offered us the use of their sunroom patio if our search is not successful before the September deadline.

For the longer term the committee is considering several scenarios: Leasing space; partnering on a contractual basis with a business that has available unused space; and investigating local governmental and civic organizations that may consider offering a home to MASF for the kudos and benefit of supporting a non-profit corporation.

We need approximately 1200/1500 square feet of secure space; half to be used for general administration and board/member meetings and the remainder as storage, and to facilitate the organization of our annual miniature art show. Preferably the facility would have to be in Pinellas County, the closer to mid-county the better.

We welcome any suggestions that may help us along the path to a new home.

The MASF membership period is January - December with annual dues of \$20.00.
